

On the first Sunday of the year, when I was still on holiday, I received a phone call from Mel Attride asking if it was possible for her daughter **Jessica** to get married to **Tom** her fiancée on the following Saturday, because his mother had suddenly become very ill. In the free churches we conduct weddings by licence of the registrar – the couple have to get permission from the registrars office for the ceremony to be performed at our church. Normally this permission takes three weeks to be granted, but sometimes the registrar is able to grant a 'special licence'. So Tom and Jess applied on the Monday.

On the Tuesday they rang me to say that they had permission. We had three days to plan a wedding! Tuesday evening we had a wedding interview down at church and covered in one evening what usually takes three or four sessions!!!! They had a suit and a wedding dress to choose and fit, a reception to book and plan, people to invite ... and all the stuff I asked them to do – choose the three Hymns, the two Bible Readings and choose the particular wording for eight sections in the service.

It was late Wednesday when we discovered that Stefan, who we thought was a secondary Authorised Person for the church, was in fact not on the registrar's system – even though he had sent renewal papers in before Christmas (the perils of email!). Thus began a stressful 24 hours as I tried to ring round other URC's to borrow an AP to fill in the registers. It was not until nearly 5 o'clock that one was found – then two more came along like buses within ten minutes! - one of these being Stefan if he could submit a new application in time, which he did. At midday on the Friday, Stefan was duly Authorised and able to register the wedding.

The day came – the first wedding I have conducted where we did not have a practice run a day or two beforehand – but Tom and Jess could just about remember Gemma's wedding from over a

year ago, and coped admirably. I, of course, had everything printed out and in front of me in my blue folder (but with me that does not necessarily help)!



I was surprised to see flowers in the church other than the roses Sheila had placed on the communion table. Tom and Jess had decided that the church looked lovely as it was, and in the rush flowers were one luxury that could be dropped. Well, a friend who was a florist had turned up out of the blue on the Friday night with an unexpected gift - a brides bouquet and two matching displays for the front of the church! How wonderful!

We sang the Hymns which Tom and Jess had chosen: "Make me a channel of your peace.", "One more step along the world I go" and "The Lord of the Dance" with Marita playing the organ for the bride she had taught in Sunday School. Tom and Jess had chosen all the passages for the service, and had primed friends to read the bible passages: Mark 10:6-9 and 1 Corinthians 13. It was wonderful to see how many people had turned out at short notice – several from our congregation - and the church had only a couple of empty seats as we did not open the partition.

'Cold' phone calls.

'Cold' phone calls.

From the neighbourhood alert :A report has been made by a Nottinghamshire resident stating that she was cold called by someone claiming to be from the **County Council**; the caller offered the resident free smoke detectors and informed her that a member of the fire brigade would come and inspect her property. The resident was also asked if she lived alone. She believed the call to be bogus and did the right thing, - **she rang the County Council to verify**.

Nottinghamshire County Council in fact **are working** in partnership with Nottinghamshire Fire & Rescue and District Councils to contact potentially eligible disabled or elderly residents to offer free fire safety checks. If the resident agrees to a free check **a confirmation letter** is sent and Nottinghamshire Fire & Rescue contact the resident to make an appointment. The Home Safety Checks carried out by Nottinghamshire Fire & Rescue officers take about 40 minutes and they will give advice and fit smoke alarm(s) if they are required.

If you do receive a call from someone claiming to be from Nottinghamshire County Council and you are at all unsure about it, **ask for their full name** and say you'll contact them back. Make sure they really do **hang up** – by listening for the dialling tone – and then ring the **County Council on 0300 500 80 80** to verify the identity of the caller. If the caller is bogus they will probably hang up without giving you any details.

If you have a computer, then the same advice about cold calls applies. I have had a few calls recently from someone who claims

that they are from Microsoft. They ask me to switch on my PC and go to a website that will check my PC for a virus they think I might have. They were **very** persistent, even when I told them that I was a computer programmer.

Of course I **did not** look at their website – it would have infected me with a very difficult to remove virus. They would then have sold me an anti-virus program to cure it. It would not have worked (for very long) so I would have to buy it again repeatedly every few months – and I would have given my card details to a criminal.

If someone called you out of the blue, claiming to be a doctor, and started asking you medical questions, would you answer him? If he then told you that you had some illness you didn't know you have -- even though you have no symptoms and feel fine -- would you pay him money to "cure" you? Of course not. So, why would you do that with your PC?

Never respond to any cold caller about your computer. They are **never genuine**. Never give them any information about your machine (make or where you bought it) or your internet provider – they will only call back later claiming to be from them!
